North Chicago Veterans Affairs (VA) Medical Center was looking for innovative ways to improve energy service and reduce costs for their 40-building and 400-bed campus. They also wanted a secure source of energy and develop a campus energy self-sufficiency program with low risk and no impact to the hospital's services. North Chicago VA partnered with ESG to design, construct, and build a fully operational, full service energy center that will provide electricity and steam to the medical center and associated facilities. The energy center also serves the needs of adjacent Navy training barracks to maximize utility effectiveness and cost savings to the U.S. government.

SOLUTION

The following energy conservation measures were implemented:

- 2 MW of electric generation
- 3 package steam boilers
- 250,000 pounds capacity per hour of steam production for VA and U.S. Navv
- Dual-fuel capability for added energy security

- New steam plant
- 2 heat recovery steam generators Centralized steam supply from energy center for VA and U.S.
 - Upgrades and modifications to **HVAC** control systems
 - Chilled water system replacements to maximize energy and cooling effectiveness
